

Basic Certificate in Substance Abuse Treatment & Prevention (CRTSUBSTABUS)

Program Description

The certificate in substance abuse, also known as a CRT-SSE, provides core understanding of drug and alcohol use, abuse, and treatment, as well as the political and legal aspects of substance abuse in society. **Note:** The CRT-SSE does not provide state certification or licensing for drug abuse counseling.

In order to successfully complete a CRT-SSE certificate, students must maintain a C grade point average or higher for all coursework.

TOCC Recommends

Students pursuing a CRT-SSE certificate should meet with their TOCC advisors every semester. Students seeking a career in Social Services may want to consider completing a 35-credit AGECA, the AA-SSE, or the AAS-SSE in tandem with the CRT-SSE.

Before Beginning the CRT-SSE

Before enrolling in General Education courses, students need to pass REA 091 or achieve a comparable COMPASS score.
