

Basic Social Services Certificate (CRTSOCIALSRV)

Program Description

The Basic Social Services Certificate helps students gain skills and knowledge in dealing with social welfare, service agencies, and community groups, as well as the needs of individual clients. The certificate can enhance students' employment and promotion opportunities in industry, business, and human services or pave the way for further studies in social services.

Note: The CRT-SSE does not provide state certification or licensing.

In order to successfully complete a CRT-SSE certificate, students must maintain a C grade point average or higher for all coursework.

TOCC Recommends

Students pursuing a CRT-SSE certificate should meet with their TOCC advisors every semester. Students seeking a career in Social Services may want to consider completing a 35-credit AGECA, the AA-SSE, or the AAS-SSE in tandem with the CRT-SSE.

Before Beginning the CRT-SSE

Before enrolling in General Education courses, students need to pass REA 091 or achieve a comparable COMPASS score.
